### CDs for general use

#### Introducing British Mammals - £19.95

An excellent introduction to British mammals with images of more than 40 species. Produced in cooperation with the Mammal Society. CD includes both 'image only', and 'image plus text' versions.

#### Focus on Bats - £19.95

Bats are gentle, social animals, but their secretive nocturnal habits have led to suspicion and persecution. *Focus on Bats* was prepared in collaboration with the Bat Conservation Trust and describes the majority of native species. Bat conservation - both problems and solutions - are discussed and suggestions for practical involvement provided along with some useful addresses. CD includes both 'image only', and 'image plus text' versions.

#### Introducing British Amphibia - £19.95

All British amphibia are in decline - threatened by loss of habitat including drainage of ponds, habitat destruction and pollution. This presentation covers all British species and discusses some of the "invaders" as well as conservation problems and some solutions. CD includes both 'image only', and 'image plus text' versions.

#### Take Care of the Countryside - £14.95

Originally prepared in association with the Duke of Edinburgh Award and the Countryside Commission this CD has been updated to take account of recent changes in countryside access. CD includes both 'image only', and 'image plus text' versions.

#### Renewable Energy for Today and Tomorrow £14.95

An educational resource for use in secondary school or for general audiences. It provides a general overview of some of the problems resulting from the use of conventional energy and examine the major sources of renewable energy. Additional resources in the form of an Acrobat file (Teacher.pdf) include a number of additional activities (copyright-free) and a comprehensive resource list. *Summarises the major sources of energy which we have come to rely on - coal, oil, gas and nuclear power - and the problems associated with them. It goes on to focus on the opportunities offered by renewable energy sources - including solar, wind, wave and geothermal power - to provide safe, less polluting energy for the future.*

## CDs For Primary Schools and Watch Clubs

#### British Wildlife in Danger - £14.95

Aims to help primary children explore some of the major threats facing British animals and plants and their habitats. The pack encourages them to think of practical ways in which they can help to conserve wildlife and wild places for the future. *Includes: 40 full screen images with key discussion questions, illustrated teaching notes, photocopy master for 24 work cards describing practical activities and a resource booklet (in PDF format) for teachers including background information and tips on how to use the pack, and identifying links to the National Curriculum.*

#### It's Your World - Don't Waste It - £14.95

Considers the complex issues surrounding waste and, in particular, its effects on land, water and air, examines the science and geography behind the problems and looks at possible solutions. Produced in association with the Gloucestershire Centre for Environmental Education. (A few slide packs left at £10.00) *Includes: 20 full frame images with key discussion questions and illustrated teaching notes; also 9 coloured 'photo work cards' illustrating problems and solutions that children can directly relate to.*
